Grade 10: Christ - the Fulfillment of the Covenant

I. Sacred Scripture – Readings of the Easter Vigil (The Sequence of Salvation)

Old Testament Readings:

- Genesis 1:1–2:2 – Creation
- Genesis 22:1-18 – Sacrifice of Isaac
- Exodus 14:15–15:1 – Crossing of the Red Sea / Song of Moses
- Isaiah 54:5–14 – God as Husband of Israel
- Isaiah 55:1–11 – Invitation to salvation
- Baruch 3:9-15, 32-4:4 – Wisdom and guidance
- Ezekiel 36:16-17, 18-28 – Promise of new life and covenant renewal

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand salvation history as preparation for Christ.
- Recognize God's faithfulness and covenant promises.
- See Christ as the fulfillment of all OT covenants.

Extra Quotations:

- "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." – Genesis 1:1
- "God will provide himself the lamb for a burnt offering." – Genesis 22:8
- "The Lord will fight for you, and you shall hold your peace." – Exodus 14:14
- "I will pour clean water upon you, and you shall be clean." – Ezekiel 36:25

Why: Shows God's consistent plan of salvation culminating in Christ, highlighting covenantal fidelity.

New Testament Readings:

- Romans 6:3-11 – Baptism and new life in Christ
- Luke 24:1-12 – Resurrection and fulfillment of prophecy

Learning Outcomes:

- Connect Christ's resurrection to OT promises.
- Recognize baptism as entrance into the covenant of salvation.
- Understand Christ as the fulfillment of salvation history.

Extra Quotations:

- "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" – Romans 6:3
- "He is not here, but has risen." – Luke 24:6

Why: Highlights the New Covenant and Christ's victory over sin and death.

II. Sacraments – The Fulfillment of the Covenant

A. Holy Baptism

• Focus: Baptismal water (Matthew 3:11-17), Paschal Candle (John 8:12; Revelation 1:8), Renewal of Baptismal Promises (Acts 2:38; Colossians 3:1-17; Ephesians 4:22-24)



Learning Outcomes:

- Understand Baptism as entry into Christ’s covenant.
- Recognize symbolism of water, candle, and grace.
- Learn to renew baptismal promises in daily life.

Extra Quotations:

- “Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ.” – Acts 2:38
- “You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him.” – Colossians 2:12
- “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness.” – John 8:12

Why: Baptism is the sacramental sign of God’s covenant, giving new life in Christ.

B. Holy Eucharist

- Focus: Participation in Christ’s Body and Blood (1 Corinthians 10:16-21)

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand the Eucharist as the covenant meal of salvation.
- Recognize unity with Christ and the Church.
- See Eucharist as continuation of the covenant of Calvary.



Extra Quotations:

- “The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ?” – 1 Corinthians 10:16
- “Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body.” – 1 Corinthians 10:17

Why: Eucharist unites believers with Christ and fulfills covenant promises.

III. Profession of Faith – Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed

- Emphasis: All articles with special focus on Article 08 (Holy Spirit and the Church)

Learning Outcomes:

- Recite and explain the Creed fully.
- Understand the role of the Holy Spirit in the covenant Church.
- Link Article 8 to Sacraments and the mission of the Church.

Extra Quotations:

- “The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me...” – Luke 4:18
- “You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you.” – Acts 1:8

Why: Shows the Holy Spirit’s role in continuing Christ’s covenant and guiding the Church’s mission.

IV. Prayer – Psalms

- Texts: Psalm 15, 18, 103

Learning Outcomes:

- Use Psalms to express covenant trust, praise, and thanksgiving.
- Recognize God’s faithfulness, mercy, and guidance.
- Connect personal prayer to biblical covenant themes.

Extra Quotations:

- “Lord, who may dwell in your sanctuary? Who may live on your holy hill?” – Psalm 15:1
- “I love you, O Lord, my strength.” – Psalm 18:1
- “The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.” – Psalm 103:8

Why: Psalms teach gratitude, trust, and praise in response to God’s covenant love.

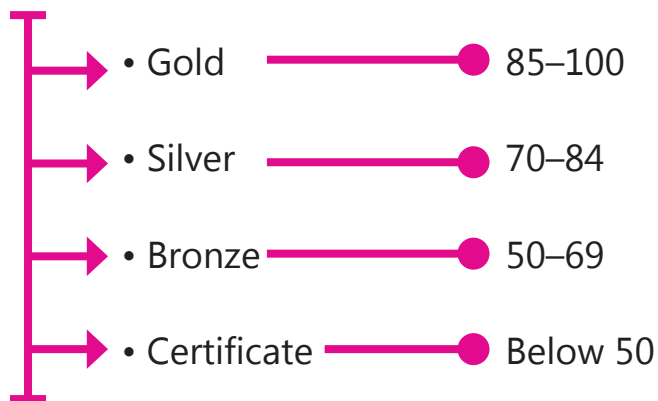
Teaching-Learning Suggestions

- Storytelling: Sequence of Salvation from Creation to Resurrection.
- Visual Aids: Water and candle for Baptism; bread and chalice for Eucharist; fire for Holy Spirit; Church symbol for covenant community.
- Creative Activities:
 - Drawing the sequence of salvation or covenant symbols.
 - Role-play: Baptism, Last Supper, Pentecost.
 - Writing personal reflections on covenant promises.
- Action Songs: Easter Vigil hymns, Psalm chants, Magnificat.

Grade 11 – Christ as the Fulfillment of the Covenant

I. Sacred Scripture – Christ in the Old and New Covenants

Old Testament – Covenants

1. The Edenic Covenant – Genesis 3:15 – Romans 5:12-21

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand the first promise of a Savior and its fulfillment in Christ.
- Recognize Christ as the victor over sin and death.

Extra Quotations:

- “I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers.” – Gen 3:15
- “Through one man’s offense, death reigned through that one.” – Rom 5:17

Why: Shows God’s salvation plan beginning from the fall; Christ overcomes sin and death.

2. The Abrahamic Covenant – Genesis 12:1-3 – Galatians 3:16

Learning Outcomes:

- Recognize God’s promise of blessing to all nations fulfilled in Christ.
- Understand Abraham as a model of faith in God’s covenant.

Extra Quotations:

- “In you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.” – Gen 12:3
- “The promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. It is Christ.” – Gal 3:16

Why: Highlights the continuity of God’s covenant and universal salvation.

3. The Noahic Covenant – Genesis 9:8-17 – 1 Peter 3:20-21

Learning Outcomes:

- See God’s mercy and covenant protection.
- Connect Noahic covenant with Christian baptism.

Extra Quotations:

- “I establish my covenant with you: never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood.” – Gen 9:11
- “Baptism now saves you, not as a removal of dirt, but as an appeal to God.” – 1 Pet 3:21

Why: Prefigures baptism; shows God’s covenantal mercy.

4. The Mosaic Covenant – Exodus 19–24 – Matthew 5–7

Learning Outcomes:

- Learn God’s law as preparation for Christ.

King David

5. The Davidic Covenant – 2 Samuel 7:12-16 – Matthew 1:1

Learning Outcomes:

- Recognize Christ as the eternal King from David's line.

Extra Quotations:

- "Your throne shall be established forever." – 2 Sam 7:16
- "The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David." – Matt 1:1

Why: God's promise of kingship fulfilled in Jesus.

New Testament – Christ and the Holy Spirit

• Jesus' Promise of the Holy Spirit – John 14:16-17, 26



Learning Outcomes:

- Know the promise of the Spirit as teacher and guide.

Extra Quotations:

- "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate."
– John 14:16
- "The Holy Spirit will teach you all things and bring to remembrance all I have said to you." – John 14:26

Why: Spirit continues Christ's mission and guides the Church.

• Holy Spirit as Guide & Advocate – John 14:15-31

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand the Spirit's role in guiding and comforting the Church.

Extra Quotations:

- "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth." – John 16:13

- “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.” – John 14:27

Why: Shows Spirit’s active presence in believers’ lives.

- **Mission of the Church (Pauline Epistles)**
1 Corinthians 12; Ephesians 4; Romans 12

Learning Outcomes:

- Learn Church’s mission to build unity and witness to Christ.



Extra Quotations:

- “As in one body we have many members, so we, though many, are one body in Christ.”
– 1 Cor 12:12
- “For the gifts and calling of God are irrevocable.” – Rom 11:29

Why: Church continues Christ’s covenant mission; each member has a role.

- **Peter the “Rock” & Apostolic Mission – Matthew 16:18**

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand Peter’s role and Apostolic authority.

Extra Quotations:

- “You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church.” – Matt 16:18
- “Feed my sheep.” – John 21:17

Why: Establishes Apostolic authority and covenant continuity.



II. Sacraments – Confirmation

Focus: Anointing with Chrism Oil (Exodus 30:22-33); “Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit” (2 Corinthians 1:21-22; Ephesians 1:13); “Soldiers of Christ” (2 Timothy 2:3)

Learning Outcomes:

- Understand Confirmation as strengthening in the Spirit and commitment to Christ.
- Recognize the sacrament as a covenantal seal for mission and witness.

Extra Quotations:

- “Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.” – 2 Cor 1:22
- “Soldiers of Christ” – 2 Tim 2:3

Why: Confirmation strengthens covenant participation and equips for Christian mission.

III. Profession of Faith – Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed

Emphasis: All articles; special focus on Articles 08 & 09

Learning Outcomes:

- Recite and explain the Creed.
- Understand the role of the Holy Spirit and the Church.
- Link Creed to Sacraments and mission of the Church.

Extra Quotations:

- “You are the Spirit of truth; the Church is built on the apostles.” – John 16:13; Matt 16:18

Why: Shows unity of faith and Spirit’s role in covenant Church.

IV. Prayer – Psalms and Canticles

Texts: Exodus 15, Psalm 103, Isaiah 12

Learning Outcomes:

- Express trust, thanksgiving, and joy in God’s covenant.
- Recognize God’s faithfulness, mercy, and guidance.

Extra Quotations:

- “The Lord is my strength and my song.” – Ex 15:2
- “The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.” – Ps 103:8
- “Sing to the Lord, for he has done gloriously.” – Isa 12:5

Why: Teaches praise, gratitude, and acknowledgment of God’s covenantal faithfulness.



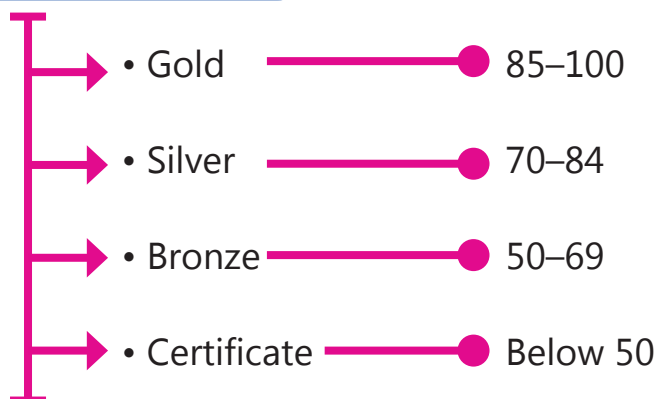
Teaching-Learning Suggestions:

- **Storytelling:** OT covenants, Christ as fulfillment, Holy Spirit, and Church mission.
- **Visual Aids:** Ark for Eden/Abraham, water & oil for Sacraments, fire for Holy Spirit, keys for Peter/Apostolic authority.
- **Creative Activities:**
 - Drawing covenant sequences and Confirmation symbols.
 - Role-play: Pentecost, Confirmation, Apostolic mission.
 - Writing reflections on covenant participation.
- **Action Songs:** Psalms, canticles, Easter hymns, Magnificat.
