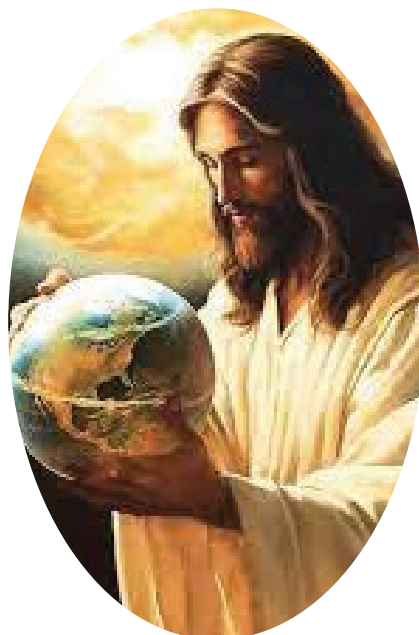

Grade 4 – God the Creator

1. General Objectives

- To help children discover God as the loving Creator of the world and of each person.
- To introduce them to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, as the Savior and the gift of God's love.
- To lead them to recognize the Holy Eucharist as Jesus' real presence among us.
- To encourage them to pray with the whole of creation in praise of God.

2. Content Organization by the Four Pillars of the Catechism

I. Sacred Scripture – Word of God

Theme Passage: Genesis 1–2 (Creation Story)

- Creation of the world in six days.
- Creation of man and woman in the image of God.
- God blesses creation and rests on the seventh day.

Supporting Passage (New Testament): Luke 2

- Birth of Jesus Christ, Son of God, in Bethlehem.
- Angels and shepherds glorify God the Creator.

Learning Outcomes:

- Children can retell the story of creation day by day.
- Recognize Jesus as the Son of God, the Creator who enters His own creation.
- Begin to see the goodness of God in nature and human life.



II. Profession of Faith – The Creed

Content: Apostles' Creed – Articles 1 & 2

1. "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth."
2. "I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord..."

Learning Outcomes:

- Children can recite and explain in simple words the meaning of God as Creator and Jesus as Son of God.
- Recognize faith as saying "I believe" together with the whole Church.

III. Sacraments – Life in Christ

Content: The Holy Eucharist

- 1 Corinthians 10:16–21 – Eucharist as sharing in Christ's Body and Blood.
- John 6:51–56 – Jesus the Bread of Life.
- Institution Narratives: Matthew 26:26–29; Mark 14:22–25; Luke 22:14–20.

Learning Outcomes:

- Link creation (God's gift of life) → Jesus (God's gift of love) → Eucharist (God's gift of Himself).
- Recognize Mass as the celebration of Jesus' gift of His Body and Blood.

IV. Prayer – Life of Praise

Content: Psalm 148 – Hymn of Creation’s Praise

- Heavens, earth, animals, plants, and people praise the Creator.

Learning Outcomes:

- Children learn selected verses of Psalm 148 by heart.
- Compose short prayers of praise in their own words.



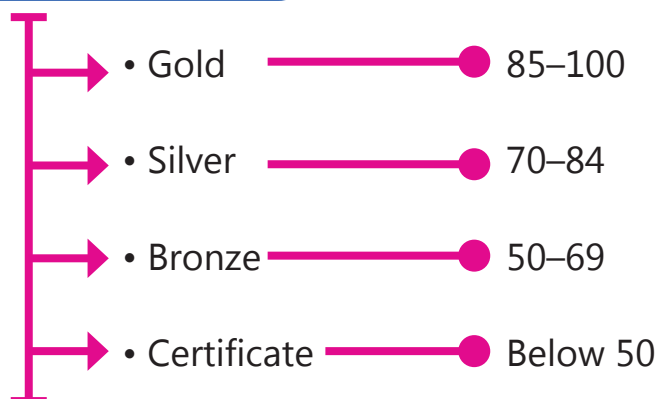
3. Teaching-Learning Suggestions

- Storytelling: Creation story, Nativity story, Last Supper story.
- Visual Aids: Creation wheel, Nativity scene charts, Eucharistic symbols.
- Action Songs: For Creation, Creed, and Psalm 148.
- Creative Activities:
 - Drawing scenes of creation.
 - Dramatization of the Nativity story.
 - Writing one-sentence prayers of praise.

5. Expected Outcomes by End of Grade 4

- Basic familiarity with the Bible’s Creation and Nativity stories.
- Ability to profess faith in God the Creator and Jesus His Son.
- Initial understanding of the Eucharist as Jesus’ gift of Himself.
- Habit of praising God through Scripture and personal prayer.

Grade 5 – God the Creator

1. General Objectives

- To help children understand God’s plan for humanity: creation, the fall, and promise of salvation.
- To recognize Jesus as the Savior promised by God the Creator.
- To grow in appreciation of the Sacrament of Reconciliation as God’s gift of mercy.
- To learn to pray for forgiveness like King David in Psalm 51.

2. Content Organization by the Four Pillars of the Catechism



I. Sacred Scripture – Word of God

Old Testament: Genesis 3–4

- The Fall of Adam and Eve: sin enters the world.
- Cain and Abel: consequences of sin, God’s justice, and mercy.

New Testament: John 3:16

- “God so loved the world that He gave His only Son…”
- God’s promise of salvation fulfilled in Jesus.

Learning Outcomes:

- Children narrate the story of the Fall and its consequences.
- Explain God’s love and promise to save humanity through Jesus Christ.

II. Profession of Faith – The Creed

Content: Apostles’ Creed – Articles 10 & 12

- Article 10: “I believe in the forgiveness of sins.”
- Article 12: “I believe in life everlasting.”

Learning Outcomes:

- Children understand the connection between sin, forgiveness, and eternal life.
- Recite and explain these articles in simple words.

III. Sacraments – Life in Christ

Content: The Sacrament of Reconciliation

- John 20:23 – “Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven.”

Learning Outcomes:

- Recognize the Sacrament of Reconciliation as Jesus’ gift of mercy.
- Learn the basic steps: contrition, confession, absolution, and penance.

IV. Prayer – Life of Praise and Repentance

Content: Psalm 51 – Prayer for Forgiveness

- King David’s prayer of repentance after sin.

Learning Outcomes:

- Children memorize selected verses of Psalm 51.
- Compose short prayers asking God for forgiveness.

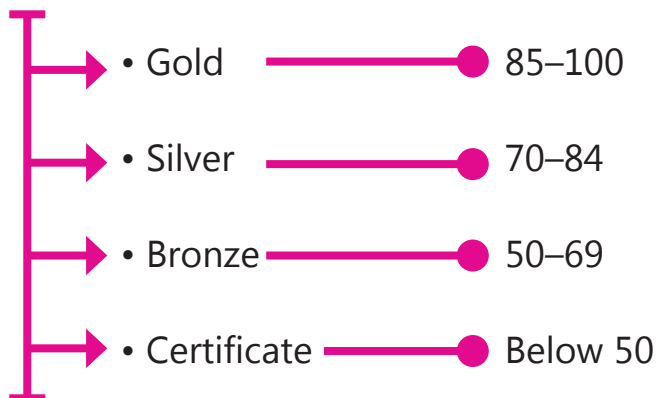
3. Teaching-Learning Suggestions

- Storytelling: Fall of Man, Cain & Abel, Jesus' promise of salvation.
- Visual Aids: Adam and Eve in Eden, Cross symbolizing John 3:16, Confession scene.
- Action Songs: God's love, forgiveness themes.
- Creative Activities:
 - Drawing "Before and After Sin" scenes.
 - Writing a personal prayer like Psalm 51.
 - Role-play of Reconciliation (priest & penitent).
