Grade 6 – God as Liberator

1. General Objectives

- To help children discover God as the One who liberates His people from slavery, sin, and fear.
- To connect the Old Testament liberation (Exodus) with Jesus Christ as the New Moses.
- To understand the Sacrament of Reconciliation as God’s liberation from sin.
- To learn to praise God through the Psalms and biblical hymns of liberation.

2. Content Organization by the Four Pillars of the Catechism

I. Sacred Scripture – Word of God

Old Testament

1. The Story of Joseph (Genesis 37 & 45–47)

- Joseph’s trials, forgiveness, and God’s providence.

2. The Exodus Event:

- The 10 Plagues (Exodus 7–12)
- The Passover (Exodus 12)
- The 10 Commandments (Exodus 20)

New Testament

1. Jesus as the “New Moses”:

- John 1:21, 25, 45
- Acts 3:22–26; 7:37

2. The Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5)



Learning Outcomes:

- Narrate the story of Joseph and the Exodus events.
- Explain why Jesus is the “New Moses.”
- Recall the Beatitudes as the law of love.

II. Profession of Faith – The Creed

- Apostles’ Creed: Articles 3, 4, 5
- Nicene Creed: focus on key truths about Christ and salvation

Learning Outcomes:

- Memorize Articles 3–5 and key Nicene Creed lines.
- Connect God’s liberation in history with salvation in Christ.



III. Sacraments – Life in Christ

- The Sacrament of Reconciliation (John 20:23)

Learning Outcomes:

- See confession as liberation from sin and a new start in life.
- Understand God’s mercy as a gift for freedom and peace.

IV. Prayer – Praise and Thanksgiving

- Psalms 135: God’s mighty deeds of liberation.
- Exodus 15: Song of Moses after crossing the Red Sea.



Learning Outcomes:

- Recite selected verses with joy and confidence.
- Compose short prayers thanking God for freedom and forgiveness.

3. Teaching-Learning Suggestions

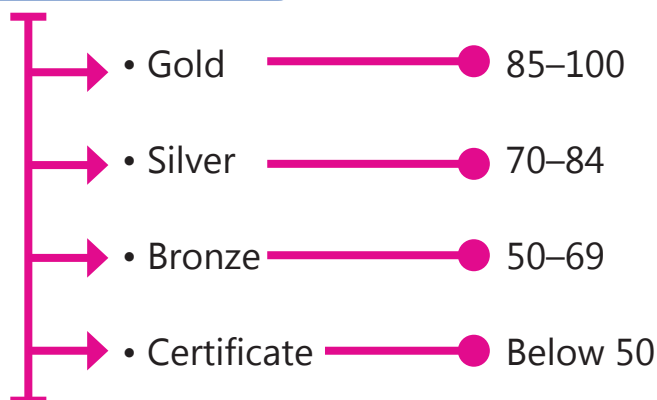
- Storytelling: Joseph’s story, Exodus events, Sermon on the Mount.
- Visual Aids: Map of Exodus journey, Moses vs. Jesus comparison chart.
- Action Songs: Exodus 15 hymn, Psalm 135 refrains.
- Creative Activities:
 - Drawing Red Sea crossing.
 - Writing a personal prayer of liberation.
 - Role-play of Joseph forgiving his brothers.

5. Expected Outcomes by End of Grade 6

- Deeper understanding of God as Liberator in Old and New Testaments.
- Recognition of Jesus as the New Moses who frees us from sin.
- Familiarity with key Creed articles and the Nicene Creed.
- Love for prayer and praise through Psalms and biblical hymns.

Additional Bible Quotations for Grade 6

I. Sacred Scripture – Word of God

(Main Texts: Joseph story, Exodus events, Sermon on the Mount)

1. "The Lord will fight for you; you have only to be still." – Exodus 14:14
2. "I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God." – Exodus 6:7
3. "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy." – Matthew 5:7
4. "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." – John 8:36

Reason: These highlight God's promise of liberation, His care, and the new law of love in Christ.

II. Profession of Faith – The Creed

(Main Texts: Apostles' Creed Articles 3–5, Nicene Creed)

1. "God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power." – 1 Corinthians 6:14
2. "He is not here, for he has risen, as he said." – Matthew 28:6
3. "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior." – Philippians 3:20

Reason: These connect liberation from sin with resurrection, eternal life, and Christian hope.

III. Sacraments – The Sacrament of Reconciliation

(Main Text: John 20:23)

1. "Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow." – Isaiah 1:18
2. "Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out." – Acts 3:19
3. "The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in love." – Psalm 145:8

Reason: These verses show God's mercy and forgiveness as liberation from sin.

IV. Prayer – Psalms 135 and Exodus 15

(Main Texts: Psalm 135; Exodus 15)

1. "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever." – Psalm 136:1
2. "The Lord is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation." – Exodus 15:2
3. "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord." – Psalm 150:6

Reason: These prayers highlight gratitude, worship, and praise for God's liberating power.

How These Verses Can Be Used

- Memory Work: One optional verse per week in addition to main readings.
- Creative Activities: Children can write or illustrate what a verse means to them.
- Quiz Preparation: Short questions can be based on the theme or meaning of the verse.
- Prayer Time: Use them as opening or closing prayers in catechism classes.

Grade 7 – GOD AS LIBERATOR

1. General Objectives

- To deepen the understanding of God’s liberating power through the prophets and the ministry of Jesus.
- To connect liberation with spiritual healing, forgiveness, and salvation in Christ.
- To appreciate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as God’s healing touch.
- To grow in prayerful trust through the Psalms of praise and supplication.

2. Content Organization by the Four Pillars of the Catechism

I. Sacred Scripture – Word of God

Old Testament: God as Liberator through the Prophets

- Isaiah 61:1-2; 14:1-2
- Jeremiah 29:14; 31:33-34
- Ezekiel 34:22; 37:12-14
- Daniel 2:44; 6:27



New Testament: Fulfillment in Christ

- Luke 4:18-20 – Jesus proclaims the Year of the Lord’s favor.
- The Ministry of Jesus:
 - Healing the Leper (Mark 1:40-45)
 - Exorcism of “Legion” (Mark 5:1-20)
 - Samaritan Woman (John 4:5-30)
 - Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10)

Learning Outcomes:

- Children recall prophecies of liberation and their fulfillment in Jesus.
- Narrate healing and conversion stories of Jesus’ ministry.
- Recognize Jesus as the one who liberates us from sin, sickness, and fear.

II. Profession of Faith – The Creed

Content: Apostles’ Creed – Articles 3, 4, 5

- Article 3: “Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary.”
- Article 4: “Suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried.”
- Article 5: “He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead.”

Learning Outcomes:

- Memorize and explain these articles in simple terms.
- See Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection as the center of liberation.

III. Sacraments – Life in Christ

Content: Anointing of the Sick

- Mark 6:13 – “They anointed with oil many who were sick and healed them.”
- James 5:14-15 – “Call the elders... pray over them, anointing with oil.”



Learning Outcomes:

- Understand Anointing of the Sick as God’s healing sacrament.
- See it as a sacrament of strength, peace, and hope for the suffering.

IV. Prayer – Praise and Trust

Content:

- Psalm 29 – God’s voice in power and majesty.
- Psalm 59 – Prayer for God’s protection and deliverance.

Learning Outcomes:

- Learn to praise God for His power and protection.
- Recite selected verses of Psalms 29 and 59 with meaning.

3. Teaching-Learning Suggestions

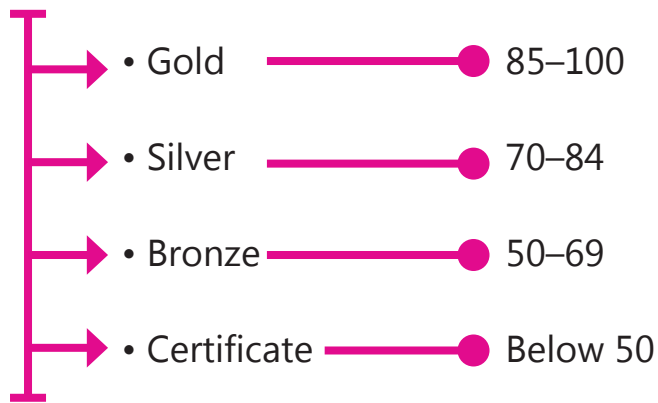
- Storytelling: Prophetic messages, healing miracles, Zacchaeus’ conversion.
- Visual Aids: Prophecy-to-fulfillment charts, miracle story posters.
- Action Songs: Liberation and healing hymns.
- Creative Activities:
 - Drawing healing scenes of Jesus.
 - Writing personal prayers based on the Psalms.
 - Role-play: Zacchaeus or Samaritan woman encounters with Jesus.

I. Sacred Scripture – Word of God

Main Texts:

- Prophets: Isaiah 61:1-2; 14:1-2; Jeremiah 29:14; 31:33-34; Ezekiel 34:22; 37:12-14; Daniel 2:44; 6:27
- Fulfillment: Luke 4:18-20
- Jesus' Ministry: Mark 1:40-45; Mark 5:1-20; John 4:5-30; Luke 19:1-10

II. Profession of Faith – The Creed

Why: They help children link the Creed's words with Scripture's promise of life and hope.

III. Sacraments – Life in Christ

Main Texts:

- Anointing of the Sick: Mark 6:13; James 5:14-15

Extra Quotations:

1. "The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up." – James 5:15
2. "I am the Lord who heals you." – Exodus 15:26
3. "Come to me, all you who are weary... and I will give you rest." – Matthew 11:28

Why: They stress God's healing presence and mercy for the suffering.

IV. Prayer – Praise and Trust

Main Texts:

- Psalms 29, 59

Extra Quotations:

1. "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?" – Psalm 27:1
2. "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." – Psalm 46:1
3. "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord." – Psalm 150:6

Why: They invite children to pray with trust, courage, and praise to God the Liberator.

- Memory Verse of the Week: One verse from any pillar.
- Prayer Time: Open or close class with a verse-based prayer.
- Art & Drama: Children illustrate or act out scenes connected to the verse.
